Service Theme THE KING SHALL COME AND BRING PERFECT JOY

The historic Christian Church gave Latin titles to each Sunday. They titled the Third Sunday in Advent "Gaudete," which means "Rejoice!" As we reach the midway point of Advent, we remember that when the King shall come, he will bring us perfect and everlasting joy. Joy is not the same thing as happiness. Happiness is an emotion. Joyfulness is a condition. Happiness comes from your circumstances. Joyfulness comes from your King entering into your heart and assuring you of his abiding love and your glorious future. Therefore, happiness is fleeting. Joyfulness is enduring.

INVOCATION AND LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLES

M: In the name of the Father and of the Son (+) and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

M: We light three Advent candles remembering Jesus, the Light of the world. He came to defeat the prince of darkness.

C: We remember Jesus, who came in answer to his people's prayers. John proclaimed him the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world.

M: We hear his call to see the light.

C: We light three Advent candles as a sign of our trust and confidence.

M: Come, Lord Jesus, be our guest.

C: Through your Word and Spirit may our souls be blessed.

Through the prophet Isaiah, the Savior-King proclaims good news of great joy for all those who are brokenhearted.


The Spirit of the LORD God is upon me, because the LORD has anointed me to preach good news to the afflicted.

He sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives and release for those who are bound,

2 to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor and the day of vengeance for our God, to comfort all who mourn,

3 to provide for those who mourn in Zion, to give them a crown of beauty instead of ashes, the oil of joy instead of mourning, a cloak of praise instead of a faint spirit, so that they will be called oaks of righteousness, a planting of the LORD to display his beauty.

SECOND READING – 1 Thessalonians 5:16-24 (EHV)


The promises of the coming King let us live with joy, regardless of present circumstances.

GOSPEL – John 1:6–8,19–28 (EHV)

M: The Gospel according to John 1:6–8,19–28

C: Glory be to you, O Lord.

Sorrow, hardship, and persecution are temporary. Future glory and eternal blessings are coming, a gift from God to all his saints.

⁶There was a man, sent from God, whose name was John. ⁷He came as an eyewitness to testify about the light so that everyone would believe through him. ⁸He was not the light, but he came to testify about the light.

¹⁹This is the testimony John gave when the Jews from Jerusalem sent priests and Levites to ask him, "Who are you?"

²⁰He confessed and did not deny. He confessed, "I am not the Christ."

²¹And they asked him, "Who are you then? Are you Elijah?"

He said, "I am not."

"Are you the Prophet?"

"No," he answered.

²²Then they asked him, "Who are you? Tell us so we can give an answer to those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?"

²³He said, "I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way of the Lord,' just as Isaiah the prophet said."

²⁴They had been sent from the Pharisees. ²⁵So they asked John, "Why then do you baptize, if you are not the Christ, or Elijah, or the Prophet?"

²⁶"I baptize with water," John answered. "Among you stands one you do not know. ²⁷He is the one coming after me, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to untie."

²⁸These things happened in Bethany beyond the Jordan, where John was baptizing.

M: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

SERMON TEXT & THEME

Isaiah 61:1-3 ... Jesus is the Joy of Christmas

NICENE CREED -
