Service Theme RETHINKING REAL STRENGTH

Most religions believe in a powerful God who will use his strength for the benefit of his followers. That invites the question: what is real strength? It is easy to assume that real strength means exerting your will over another by using any means necessary, including force. But this week we see Jesus Christ demonstrate a different kind of strength. We have come to Holy Week. It begins with Jesus humbly riding a donkey colt straight into the hands of his enemies. As the week progresses, it will appear that Christ's adversaries are the ones in a position of power and Jesus is in a position of weakness. Yet what Christ does this holy week—setting his divine strength aside, being passive in the face of death—would change the world. To do what Christ did for us and our salvation took real strength.

CALL TO WORSHIP

Pastor. In the name of the Father and of the Son (+) and of the Holy Spirit.

All: Amen.

P: On the first Palm Sunday, people lined the streets as Jesus rode into the city. Anthems filled the air as men, women, and children raised their palm branches as a sign of victory and peace. Today we worship that same Jesus who rode into Jerusalem on his way to win salvation for the world.

Men: Blessed is he who comes in the Name of the Lord! Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!

Women: Shout for joy to the Lord, all the earth.

Worship the Lord with gladness; come before him with joyful songs.

All Sing: Hosanna, loud hosanna, The little children sang;
Through pillared court and temple,
The lovely anthem rang.
To Jesus, who had blessed them,
Close folded to his breast,
The children sang their praises,
The simplest and the best. (CW 130:1)

P: Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name.

Men: For the Lord is good and his love endures forever; his faithfulness continues through all generations.

Women: Blessed is he who comes in the Name of the Lord! Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!

All Sing: From Olivet they followed Mid an exultant crowd,

The victor palm branch waving And chanting clear and loud. The Lord of saints and angels Rode on in lowly state Nor scorned that little children Should on his bidding wait. (CW 130:2)

- P: Some of the Pharisees in the crowd did not want the people to praise Jesus. They said to him: "Teacher, rebuke your disciples!" But Jesus replied: "I tell you the truth, if they keep quiet, the stones will cry out!"
- All: How can we be still? How can we remain silent?
 Let the earth sing and the heavens rejoice!
 Let all that has breath praise the Lord!
 Blessed is the King who comes in the Name of the Lord! Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!
 Amen.

All Sing: "Hosanna in the highest!" That ancient song we sing,
For Christ is our Redeemer,
The Lord of heav'n, our King.
Oh, may we ever praise him
With heart and life and voice
And in his royal presence
Eternally rejoice. (CW 130:3)

PRAYER OF THE DAY

P: We praise you, O God, for the great acts of love by which you have redeemed us through your Son, Jesus Christ. We confess that we have no right to worship you, for we are sinful people. But we also know and trust that Jesus lived and died for us, to make us righteous and holy in your sight. As he was acclaimed by those who scattered their garments and branches of palms in his path, so may we always hail him as our King and follow him with confidence; the One who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

OLD TESTAMENT LESSON Zechariah 9:9-12 EHV

The prophet Zechariah foretold a king who is both infinitely strong and perfectly humble. He would enter Jerusalem riding on the colt of a donkey.

⁹Rejoice greatly, Daughter of Zion! Shout, Daughter of Jerusalem! Look! Your King is coming to you. He is righteous and brings salvation. He is humble and is riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey. ¹⁰I will cut off the chariot from Ephraim and the horse from Jerusalem. The battle bow will be taken away. and he will proclaim peace to the nations. His kingdom will extend from sea to sea, from the River to the ends of the earth. ¹¹As for you, because of the blood of my covenant with you, I will release your prisoners from the waterless pit. ¹²Return to the stronghold, you prisoners who have hope. This very day I declare that I will restore double to you.

PSALM 24 (CWS p. 42)

Refrain:

Sing hosanna! Loud hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, the name of the Lord!

The earth is the Lord's, and everything in it, the world, and all who <u>live</u> in it; for he founded it up<u>on</u> the seas and established it upon the <u>waters</u>.

Who may ascend the hill <u>of</u> the Lord?
Who may stand in his <u>ho</u>ly place?
He who has clean hands and a <u>pure</u> heart,
he will receive blessing from God his Savior.

Lift up your heads, O you gates; be lifted up, you ancient doors,

that the King of glory may come in.

Who is this King of <u>glory?</u>
The Lord strong and mighty, the Lord mighty in battle.

Lift up your heads, O you gates; lift them up, you ancient doors,

that the King of glory may come in.
Who is he, this King of glory?
The Lord Almighty—he is the King of glory.

Glory be to the Father and <u>to</u> the Son and to the Holy <u>Spir</u>it, as it was in the beg<u>in</u>ning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.

EPISTLE Hebrews 12:1-3 (EHV)

Jesus demonstrated strength by enduring the cross for the joy set before him: redeeming us from our sin.

Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us get rid of every burden and the sin that so easily ensnares us, and let us run with patient endurance the race that is laid out for us. ²Let us keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, who is the author of our faith and the one who brings it to its goal. In view of the joy set before him, he endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of God's throne.

³Carefully consider him who endured such hostility against himself from sinful people, so that you do not grow weary and lose heart.

Verse of the Day

"The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified." (John 12:23)

Gospel Lesson Mark 11:1-10 (EHV)

The almighty Son of God demonstrates real strength by humbly riding into Jerusalem knowing he will soon be put to death.

As they approached Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, on the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples ²and told them, "Go into the village ahead of you. As soon as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, on which no one has ever sat. Untie it and bring it here. ³If anyone asks you, 'Why are you doing this?' say, 'The Lord needs it, and he will send it back here without delay.'"

⁴They left and found a colt on the street, tied at a door; and they untied it. ⁵Some who were standing there asked them, "What are you doing, untying that colt?" ⁶The disciples answered them just as Jesus had instructed them, and the men let them go.

⁷They brought the colt to Jesus, threw their garments on it, and Jesus sat on it. ⁸Many people spread their garments on the road. Others spread branches that they had cut from the fields. ⁹Those who went in front and those who followed were crying out,

Hosanna!

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! ¹⁰Blessed is the coming kingdom of our father David! Hosanna in the highest!
