Belonging to God

Imagine renting a rundown house overseen by a horrible, mean property manager. One day, however, you receive an official notice stating that God himself purchased your house. God doesn't want you to move out; instead, He wants to renovate your house so He can live in it with you. He promises to pay for everything: all the upgrades, fixings, furnishings... everything. Unlike your previous landowner, God does not want to charge you a single penny in rent. Instead, He promises to upgrade everything you have for free. Not only that, but He invites you to spend as much time with Him as you want. So, let me ask you: if your house belonged to God and was the place where He lived, how would you treat it?

The situation I described is not theoretical. Replace the word "house" with "body" and you have the situation St. Paul describes in 1 Corinthians 6:19–20.

¹⁹Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit, who is within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, ²⁰for you were bought at a price. Therefore glorify God with your body.

Even though we all were once enslaved to the devil, Jesus redeemed us (bought us back) with his own blood. Our bodies, therefore, belong to God - purchased to be his temple, his home. He repaired the damage the devil has done - remodelling us with His righteousness and furnishing us with every spiritual gift He wants us to have. Since God has made your body His home, how should you treat it?

Right before our text, Paul warns against sexual sins. Even though his specific example deals with prostitution, his words apply to all sexual sins (fornication, adultery, pornography, etc...) and all other sins against our body (e.g. drug abuse, drunkenness, gluttony, etc...) Let us realize the noble purpose for which Christ redeemed our bodies: to be God's holy temple. Just think: the almighty God chooses to live with and inside of you. Let this realization move you to want to let the Holy Spirit clean your heart through repentance and adorn your soul with the righteousness Christ offers you through faith. Flee from the temptations to sin that corrupt your body. How? By focusing on Jesus and enjoying the fellowship with the Holy Spirit that God intends you to have as you meditate on His Gospel promises.

<u>Prayer</u>

(from Psalm 51:1-2, 10-12 of Beck's "AAT" Bible)

O God, You are so kind — be merciful to me, Your grace is so great — wipe out my wrong; wash me thoroughly from my guilt, and cleanse me from my sin. Create a clean heart for me, O God, and give me a steady new spirit. Don't banish me from Your presence or take Your

Holy Spirit from me. Give me again the joy of Your salvation and a willing spirit to strengthen me. Amen.

Updates from the Board of Stewardship and Treasurer

I. <u>E-Transfer Process</u>

We will be continuing to use the e-transfer process in 2024. There are more than 16 members using it regularly. If you wish to contribute monthly versus weekly to minimize the number of transactions that would be totally acceptable. II. Regular Offerings and Budgets

Regular Offerings: Please find below the financial summary as of June 2, 2024 of all regular offerings collected to date being applied toward our Current Church Operating budget requirement of \$134,630 for 2024 increased from \$131,250 for 2023.

As of June 2, 2024

Offerings Received - \$61,071

Offerings Budget - \$55,594

As of March 10, 2024

Offerings Received - \$24,011

Operating Budget - \$25,305

After 22 weeks we are approximately \$5,500 ahead of the budget projection. This is a wonderful transition (Increase of \$6,800) since March 17th. However, there were several annual contributions made during this time. Please continue to make your regular weekly /

monthly contributions throughout the summer and we will very likely achieve our budget for the year.

So overall, we get an A for the first half of the year. But that was just the mid-term – we still have a final to write (Just trying to spice up the financial report with my school humour).

An additional note for everyone – we have been reviewing our Sun Life investment to ensure that they still are the best investment for the church. Part of the rational was based on increased interest rates (4.5- 6%). What we have determined so far is that if we want to purchase some guaranteed investments (GICs) – for a fixed return – we will very likely purchase these from a specialized bank versus an insurance company to ensure that we can get a 0.5 to 1% better interest rate. Various institutions are being evaluated and we will move a portion of the funds once we find the right one for the church.
