

I deserve your punishment both now and forever.


But Jesus, my Savior, paid for my sins with his innocent suffering and death.


³⁷"You are a king then?" Pilate asked.

Nicene Creed

Extend your healing power to those who are sick and suffering in body or mind. [*Special petitions*.] Give patience and compassion to all who care for the sick and dying.

Lift the eyes of the distressed to your love in Christ.

Gracious God, you govern and direct all things and you love all people. Hear our prayers, spoken and silent, and answer them in your wisdom and grace.




