Proclamation of the Birth of Christ

Today, the twenty-fifth day of December,

- many ages after God created the heavens and the earth, when man and woman were formed in his image;
 - long after the great flood, when God set the rainbow in the sky as a sign of the covenant;
 - twenty-one centuries from the birth of Abraham,
 - fifteen centuries from the exodus of the people of Israel out of Egypt,
 - one thousand years from the enthronement of David as king,
 - in the six hundred and ninety-eighth Olympiad,
 - in the seven hundred and fifty-second year from the founding of the city of Rome,
 - in the forty-second year of the reign of Caesar Augustus, at a time when the whole world was at peace,
 - it pleased God to send his only begotten Son and eternal Word to the world to become man and to teach us God's love, to suffer, die, and rise from the dead for our salvation.

Today is the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ, God made flesh.

- To God Incarnate, to the Infant who humbled himself and took our form, becoming a child of man to make children of God;
 - to the One who later walked among us to teach us the way of salvation

and who loved us so much as to give his life for it:

to him be glory, honor, and adoration forever and ever.

and all people will see it together.


The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us.


We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.



Christmas Confession of Faith

Excerpts from the Athanasian Creed

It is furthermore necessary for eternal salvation truly to

believe that our Lord Jesus Christ also took on human flesh.

Now this is the true Christian faith:

We believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ, God's Son, is both God and man.

He is God,

eternally begotten from the nature of the Father, and he is man,

born in time from the nature of his mother,

fully God, fully man,

with rational soul and human flesh,

equal to the Father as to his deity, less than the Father as to his humanity;

and though he is both God and man, Christ is not two persons, but one,

one, not by changing the deity into flesh, but by taking the humanity into God;

one, indeed, not by mixture of the natures,


but by unity in one person;

for just as the rational soul and flesh are one human being, so God and man are one Christ.

He suffered for our salvation, descended into hell, rose the third day from the dead.

He ascended into heaven, is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty, and from there will come to judge the living and the dead.

This is the true Christian faith.

Let your peace reign in the hearts of all.

Hear us, Lord, as we pray in silence.
