


Sunday, January 26, 2025 The Third Sunday after Epiphany

Service Theme REJECTION IS NOT PROOF OF FAILURE

When you are trying to share some important information with someone, but they refuse to listen or perhaps totally reject what you are saying, it feels like you have failed. This is especially true when someone rejects the gospel! We proclaim the good news because want others to know the love of Christ. When people are disinterested in God's Word, we feel like we've failed. So, here is this week's epiphany. Rejection is not proof of failure. Precisely because the gospel is divine revelation, it is guaranteed to be rejected by many. God's Word offends like an unwelcome diagnosis from the doctor. When someone rejects God's Word (including us), that rejection is proof that God's Word powerfully cuts straight to the heart of mankind's biggest problem—sin. Yet, what causes Jesus' words to hurt is what gives them power to heal. That reality encourages us to receive God's Word with joy and to proclaim it boldly to others.





First Reading

Isaiah 61:1-6

Israel had rejected the Lord. So God allowed them to be conquered and carried off as captives. Yet, he also promised to forgive their rejection and grant them freedom.

The Spirit of the LORD God is upon me, because the LORD has anointed me to preach good news to the afflicted.

He sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives and release for those who are bound,

²to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor and the day of vengeance for our God, to comfort all who mourn,

³to provide for those who mourn in Zion, to give them a crown of beauty instead of ashes, the oil of joy instead of mourning, a cloak of praise instead of a faint spirit, so that they will be called oaks of righteousness, a planting of the LORD to display his beauty.

⁴Then they will rebuild ancient ruins.

They will raise up what was formerly devastated, and they will renew ruined cities,

which have been devastated for generations.

⁵Strangers will stand and shepherd your flock, and foreigners will be your farmers and vinedressers.

⁶You will be called the LORD's priests.

You will be named ministers of our God.

You will eat the wealth of nations, and you will boast about their riches.

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Second Reading


Acts 4:8-12

Even though the Jewish religious leaders rejected Jesus and had Him killed, God raised Him to life, placing him as the cornerstone of our faith. There is no salvation apart from Him.

⁸Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, "Rulers of the people and elders of Israel, ⁹if we are being questioned today for a kind act that was done for the lame man, as to how this man has been healed, ¹⁰let it be known to all of you and to all the people of Israel that it was by the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead! By him this man stands before you healed. ¹¹This Jesus is the stone that was rejected by you builders, which has become the cornerstone.

¹²"There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to people by which we must be saved."

Gospel Luke 4:16–30

In one of Jesus' first sermons, delivered in his hometown, people took offense at his words and ultimately rejected him.

¹⁶He went to Nazareth, where he had been brought up. As was his custom, he went into the synagogue on the Sabbath day and stood up to read. ¹⁷The scroll of the prophet Isaiah was handed to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written:

¹⁸The Spirit of the Lord is on me,

because he anointed me to preach good news to the poor.

He has sent me to proclaim freedom to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind,

to set free those who are oppressed,

¹⁹and to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor.

²⁰He rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant, and sat down. The eyes of everyone in the synagogue were fastened on him. ²¹He began to tell them, "Today, this Scripture is fulfilled in your hearing."

²²They all spoke well of him and were impressed by the words of grace that came from his mouth. And they kept saying, "Isn't this Joseph's son?"


²³He told them, "Certainly you will quote this proverb to me, 'Physician, heal yourself!' Do here in your hometown everything we heard you did in Capernaum." ²⁴And he said, "Amen I tell you: No prophet is accepted in his hometown. ²⁵But truly I tell you: There were many widows in Israel in the days of Elijah, when the sky was shut for three years and six months, while a great famine came over all the land. ²⁶Elijah was not sent to any of them, but to a widow of Zarephath, in Sidon. ²⁷And there were many lepers in Israel in the time of Elisha the prophet, yet not one of them was healed except Naaman the Syrian."

²⁸All those who were in the synagogue were filled with rage when they heard these things. ²⁹They got up and drove him out of the town. They led him to the brow of the hill on which their town was built, in order to throw him off the cliff. ³⁰But he passed through the middle of them and went on his way.

Silent prayer


We remember with thanksgiving those who have loved and served you, who now rest from their labors, *[especially... here name the person]*. Console those who are mourning or living with sadness.


Keep us in the true faith, and bring us at last to the joys of heaven.

Lord's Prayer


Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread.

now and forever. Amen.


