Easter Service with Holy Communion

Service Theme DEATH HAS LOST ITS STING

Death can sting in many ways, casting a shadow over every moment of life. No matter what earthly joy you are experiencing, death guarantees it won't last. It separates us from loved ones. It instills in us a feeling of dread. However, because Jesus rose from the grave, death has lost its sting for those who put their faith in Him. His resurrection proves that God accepted Jesus' sacrifice as the complete payment for all sin. There is no condemnation for those who are in Christ. Moreover, Jesus' resurrection assures us that our Christian loved ones are not lost. We will see them again in the resurrection of all flesh on the Last Day. Because He lives, death has lost its sting.

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CONFESSION OF SINS



God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given his only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son (+) and of the Holy Spirit.

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Christ is risen, so death has lost its sting.





I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. ⁶He is not here. He has risen, just as he said. Come, see the place where the Lord lay. ⁷Go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has risen from the dead! And look, he is going ahead of you to Galilee. There you will see him.' See, I have told you!"

⁸They hurried away from the tomb, with fear and great joy, and ran to tell his disciples. ⁹Suddenly Jesus met them and said, "Greetings!"

They approached, took hold of his feet, and worshipped him.

Amen.


