Confession of St. Peter / Confirmation Sunday

Service Theme

**JESUS IS THE CHRIST,
THE SON OF THE LIVING GOD**

Peter became a disciple of Jesus, and the Holy Spirit made it clear to him who Jesus is: a truth He confessed boldly to all.

Today, we rejoice in the Spirit's work of revealing Jesus' identity to William Bellefeuille (Divine Word), Cora Lange (Our Shepherd), and Leah Contois (Our Shepherd) as they confirm the faith in which they were baptized by publicly confessing it and receiving their first Communion.

Jesus calls Peter blessed for confessing Him as the Christ, God's Son – a truth that only God could reveal to Him.

¹³When Jesus came into the region of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, “Who do people say the Son of Man is?”

¹⁴They said, “Some say John the Baptist, others say Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.”

¹⁵He said to them, “But you, who do you say that I am?”

By him this man stands before you healed. ¹¹This Jesus is the stone that was rejected by you builders, which has become the cornerstone.

¹²“There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to people by which we must be saved.”

¹³When they saw the boldness of Peter and John and found out that they were uneducated and untrained men, they were astonished and took note of the fact that these men had been with Jesus.



Reading

Colossians 2:6–15 (EHV)

Paul encourages us to strengthen our faith, so we don't lose it to worldly ideas. He reminds us of who Jesus is and what He has done to save us. In Him we have victory over Satan and every evil. May these Gospel truths encourage us to keep confessing Christ to the world.

⁶Therefore, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to walk in him, ⁷by being rooted and built up in him, and strengthened in the faith just as you were taught, while you overflow in faith with thanksgiving.

⁸See to it that no one takes you captive through philosophy and empty deceit, which are in accord with human tradition, namely, the basic principles of the world, but not in accord with Christ. ⁹For all the fullness of God's being dwells bodily in Christ. ¹⁰And you have been brought to fullness in him. Christ is the head over every ruler and authority. ¹¹You were also circumcised in him, with a circumcision not done by human hands, in the putting off of the body of flesh, in the circumcision of Christ, ¹²when you were buried with Christ in baptism. And in baptism you were also raised with him through the faith worked by the God who raised Christ from the dead.

¹³Even when you were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made you alive with Christ by forgiving us all our trespasses. ¹⁴God erased the record of our debt brought against us by his legal demands. This record stood against us, but he took it away by nailing it to the cross. ¹⁵After disarming the rulers and authorities, he made a public display of them by triumphing over them in Christ.

Sermon Text & Theme

John 17:11b–19... Jesus prays for you:

- 1) *That you remain protected under His name*
- 2) *That you keep and confess His Word in this world*

Holy Father, protect them by your name, which you gave me, so that they may be one as we are one.¹² While I was with them, I kept those you gave me safe in your name. I protected them and not one of them was destroyed, except the son of destruction, so that the Scripture might be fulfilled.

¹³“But now I am coming to you, and I am saying these things in the world, so that they may be filled with my joy.

¹⁴I have given them your word. The world hated them, because they are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. ¹⁵I am not asking that you take them out of the world, but that you protect them from the Evil One. ¹⁶They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world.

¹⁷“Sanctify them by the truth. Your word is truth. ¹⁸As you sent me into the world, I also sent them into the world. ¹⁹I sanctify myself for them, so they also may be sanctified by the truth.

Prayer for our Youth

Be with our children as they continue to mature. Teach them the value of honest labor and faithful stewardship. Guide and direct them as they prepare for their life's vocations. Remind them that their highest joy is found in using talents and abilities in service to you.

Hear us, Lord, as we bring you our private petitions.

Silent prayer.

Most of all, dear Lord, we ask you to keep this and every generation faithful to your truth. Strengthen believers through regular use of Word and sacrament. Open our mouths to share the gospel with friends and acquaintances, that each new generation may know the praiseworthy deeds of the Lord. Amen.

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. The Rite of Confirmation with Catechetical Examination

Brother/Sisters in Christ, our Lord Jesus said to his disciples: “All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age.”

In obedience to the Lord’s command, you have been baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. You have been taught the precious truths of the Christian faith as confessed by the Evangelical Lutheran Church. You know what God has given you by his grace and what he expects of you as his dear child. You now have the privilege of receiving the Lord’s body and blood in the Sacrament of Holy Communion.

You are here to make a public profession of your Christian faith. The apostle Paul, writing to the Romans, said: “If you confess with your mouth, ‘Jesus is Lord’ and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you confess and are saved. Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.”

Therefore, lift up your hearts to the God of all grace and joyfully answer these questions.

What does Jesus give you in the Lord's Supper?

He gives me His true body and blood for the forgiveness of all my sins.

Do you believe that Jesus gives you His actual body and blood the Lord's Supper, or are the bread and wine only symbols and not really Jesus' body and blood?

It is His true body and blood.

What are the words of Jesus that teach you that the Lord's Supper gives you the body and blood of Jesus to eat and to drink?'

Take, eat; this is My body, which is given for you. Drink from it, all of you; this cup is my blood of the new covenant, which is poured out for you for the forgiveness of sins.

Does the Lord's Supper strengthen your faith in Jesus?

Do you this day, in the presence of God and of this congregation, acknowledge that in Baptism, God gave you forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation?

I do.

Do you reject the devil along with all his lies and empty promises?

I do.

Do you believe in God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit, as you confessed in the Apostles' Creed?

Yes

Do you believe all the books of the Bible are the inspired Word of God?

I do.

Do you believe that the teaching of the Evangelical Lutheran Church, as you have learned to know it from Luther's Small Catechism, is faithful and true to the Word of God?

I do.

Do you intend to continue steadfast in this teaching and to endure all things, even death, rather than fall away from it?

I do, and I ask God to help me.

Do you intend faithfully to conform all your life to the teachings of God's Word, to be faithful in the use of the Word and sacrament, and in faith and action remain true to God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—as long as you live?

I do, and I ask God to help me.

(The minister addresses the congregation)

Since it is God alone who enables us both to will and to do his good pleasure, it is right for us, dear friends in Christ, to call on him for *these confirmands*, that he would graciously complete the good work which he has begun in *them*. Let us, therefore, bow our heads and pray.

Move *them* to faithfully hear your Holy Word and joyfully receive your Sacrament that *they* may again and again be assured of your gracious love and forgiveness. Lord, in your mercy,

Hear our prayer.

Give *them* the sincere desire to die each day to sin and put on the new self, created to be like God in true righteousness and holiness. Lord, in your mercy,

Hear our prayer.

Clothe *them* with the kindness, humility, and patience of Christ and so that *they* may live at peace with all the members of Christ's body. Lord, in your mercy,

Hear our prayer.

Protect *them* from the powers of evil, and give *them* the weapons to fight against the devil. Lord, in your mercy,

Hear our prayer.

Keep *them* faithful and holy so that *they* may inherit eternal life, through Jesus Christ our Lord.





Confession and Absolution

My fellow disciples, in the Lord's Supper, Jesus is coming to us in a very special way: as we receive the bread and the wine of communion, Jesus is present to give us his actual body and blood, and to pronounce forgiveness to each one of us personally. Because of the Lord's presence and his forgiveness in communion, the Apostle Paul wrote, "*A man ought to examine himself before he eats of the bread and drinks of the cup.*" (1 Corinthians 11:28) Therefore, before the Lord comes to meet with us, let us honestly ask ourselves before God who knows our hearts:

- 1) Do you confess that you have sinned against God and deserve his anger and punishment? If so, then answer, "I do confess!"

I do confess!

It is good for you to confess because God's word says, "*When I kept silent, my bones wasted away through my groaning all day long.*" (Psalm 32:3)

- 2) Are you sorry for the sins you have committed against God by things you have done, said and thought, and by the things you have failed to do? If so, then answer, "I do repent!"

I do repent!

It is right for you to repent because God's Word says, "*If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not within us.*" (1 John 1:8)

3) Do you now believe that God will forgive you and save you for the sake of Jesus' perfect life and redeeming death? If so, then answer, "I do believe!"

I do believe!

It is right for you to believe because Jesus himself says, "God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." (John 3:16)

4) Do you now promise by the power of the Holy Spirit to make every effort to turn away from sin and live for your Lord? If so, then answer, "I do so promise!"

I do so promise!

It is right for you to promise because God's Word says, "Produce fruit in keeping with repentance." (Matthew 3:8)
